


See you tomorrow, God willing!





SYNOPSIS

See you tomorrow, God willing! is a happy documentary about the daily day life of a group of old Franciscan sisters who are disappearing.

Seventeen Franciscan sisters, all deep into their eighties, collectively run a convent somewhere in Spain. They begin at dawn with their religious duties and more worldly tasks such as mopping and sewing. While the passing conversations do cover biblical questions, they also touch on life's more banal subjects. In between, the sisters prepare for a birthday and judge the persimmon harvest. The camera is often set up in shadowy halls with doors from which sisters appear and disappear. The filming is as patient as the women themselves have become over the years. In the past these sisters traveled the world to help people, but now their world is small. With their ends in sight, they're continually surprised by the changing outside world. Will their charitable and contemplative lifestyle continue to exist after they're gone?

DIRECTOR'S LETTER

Years ago, I found tens of photographs that have belonged to a nun next to a container: a brief review of a lifetime. I picked them up, I took them home and I watched them for hours. I met a nurse, full of life, dressed in robe, always surrounded by women of the same age and often portrayed with babies. Who was that woman? Or rather, who were all those women who, being young, had given their lives and left their families behind, their homes and the possibility of having their own, to have children, lovers, to disobey, to love physically...?

'See you tomorrow, God willing!' is a documentary film that is born of the desire to understand this mysterious female universe.

AINARA VERA

Ainara Vera (Spain, 1985). Studied Audiovisual Communication at the University of Navarra and obtained a mastersdegree in Creative Documentary at Pompeu Fabra University in Barcelona. Her first short documentary, "Sertres", world premiered at Locarno Film Festival in 2014. It was awarded with the Navarre Young Artist award. She co-directed the film "Demonstration" along with other 32 students and the Russian filmmaker Victor Kossakovsky. It was screened in multitud of festivals around the world including Hots Docs, True/False, Ambulante or DocsBarcelona among others. Her work in progress "Mira, mi rey" was screened in Punto de Vista International Film Festival in 2016. She works as First Assistant Director in Victor Kossakovsky's films "Aquarela" and "Krogunfant".


